Themes, Outcomes & Measures. These act as a 'menu' of the different ways suppliers can fulfil their social value obligations in alignments with Our Plan for Barnet

Social Value Matrix

It guides bidders to produce clearly defined commitments where crucial information such as the offer, quantity, milestones, and responsible person(s) are stated.

Monetary Values

These are values that enable bidders to quantify their social value commitments. Each TOM has been assigned a monetary value.

Proxy Values

These are average sums that correlate to the yearly uplift in life satisfaction for individuals, the government, and the community. They are established using public sector data. When reporting, we will use proxy values to calculate how much social value has been generated by suppliers.

Liquidated Damages

Compensation to pay the council for failure to deliver specific commitments. It will be at the sole discretion of London Borough of Barnet, as to whether it grants relief to the supplier in respect of liquidated damages. Our preference is to work with the supplier to find a solution, therefore we would only seek to apply this as last resort.

Social Value Impact Fund

The Social Value Impact Fund (SVIF) is made up of financial contributions from suppliers, and it is used by Barnet Council to support impactful community initiatives, primarily those that aim to reduce poverty and inequality in the borough.

FTE

Full-time Equivalent (35 hours).

Local

Resident or business with a London Borough of Barnet postcode.

Day

Working day which equates to 7 hours.

BARNET COUNCIL TOMs

The total amount committed to financial contributions, including donations, sponsorships, rebates, support for tree planting, and other monetary support, must not exceed 50% of the total proposed social value commitment.

For example, if a contract is worth £300,000, the minimum social value reinvestment expectation of 5% would be £15,000. Therefore, if you choose to make financial commitments, they can only amount up-to £7,500.
